TOPOGRAPHIA RALLY SUNDAY October 6th 2024

ADDITIONAL SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS

1. Boundless/CSMA Club (Southern) (Farnborough Group) will promote a navigational scatter event, the Topographia Rally, on Sunday October 6th 2024. The Topographia is a treasure hunt scatter type of event, of about 8 hours, in which competitors determine their own route, mainly with the aid of photographs and clues relating to various topographical features found on the Ordnance Survey Landranger map.
2. The event is governed by the General Regulations of the MSA Ltd, these ASRs and any Final Instructions which may be issued at the start.
3. The event is open to members of Boundless/CSMA and invited Clubs including;
Guildford MC, Hants & Berks MC, Cov & Warws MC, Dolphin MC, RSSOC, Veterans CC, Oxford MC, Bristol MC, Basingstoke MC and Wessex MC.
4. The event is held under a Certificate of Exemption permit granted by the MSA Ltd.
5. The Start will be at the Hare & Hounds, Bath Road, Speen, Newbury. Post code RG14 1QY.
(map reference 456681 OS Map 174). There will be hopefully coffee etc available to purchase and toilets are available. We need to park at the rear row of the car park.
The event will start at 9.45 with signing on commencing at 9.30. The Finish will also be at The Hare & Hounds and will be open from 16.45 to 17.45. There will be 10 minutes allowed between 17.45 and 17.55 but late finishers will be penalised 10 points per minute late.
6. The event will take place on OS Map 174 (Newbury & Wantage – Landranger). The issue reprinted in February 2016 has been used to plan the event. There is no fixed route. Mileage covered (not expected to exceed 120 miles) and locations visited will be at the discretion of the individual crews.
7. Any car conforming to the MSA vehicle and tyre regulations may be used for this event. All cars will be liable to scrutiny before signing on and will be identified by their registration numbers.
8. There will be a class for experts, one for novices and a beginner's class. A novice crew is one which has not won an award in a rally or treasure hunt event since 1st January 2019. Beginners are those who have not entered a navigational scatter type rally before.
9. Awards will be presented as follows;

Winners overall	Annual Trophy plus two permanent awards
Runners up	Two permanent awards
Best Mixed Crew	Two permanent awards (if 5 or more in class)
Best Novices	Two permanent awards (if 5 or more in class)
Best Beginners	Two permanent awards (if 5 or more in class).

10. There will be a small scoring penalty for entries that comprise more than two in a crew (excluding children under 10). For experts, an extra 20 points of answers will be discounted (two 10 point or one 20 point correct answer) and for novices, one correct 10 point answer will be discounted.
11. Full details of scoring will appear in the roadbook which will be issued at the start. There are 28 questions (20 based on photographs) of varying values of which a maximum target (apart from those involved in 10 above) of 16 should be answered. Beginners will need to answer 12 of 18 simplified questions at most.
12. The maximum entry is 30 and the minimum 10. The organisers reserve the right to cancel the event if this minimum number is not reached. The entry list opens with the publication of these regulations and closes on Thursday October 3rd 2024. All entries must be made on the official entry form and an entry fee of £12.00 is payable. Cheques should be made payable to CSMA (Farnborough Group). The entry form can be sent by e-mail to the Secretary of the Event with payment being made on the day. 14. Entrants can assume their entry has been accepted unless notified to the contrary. Efforts will be made to acknowledge entries by e-mail. Final Instructions which will be issued at the start will include details of any Black Spots or Quiet Zones etc.
15. Failure to observe Black Spots and Quiet Zones can result in exclusion from the event.
16. To be classified as a finisher, a team must report to the Finish by the stated closing time or lapsed closing time. Provisional results will be issued at the Finish.

Protests may be made to the Organisers but their decision is final. Confirmed results will be Issued by post or e-mail.
17. Apart from the OS Map specified above, you will need a magnifying glass, a romer, pens, pencils, a rubber and perhaps stickers to mark locations on the map.
